- Hike in the Alps


→ ACCOMMODATIONS



This program is **open to advanced undergraduate, masters, and doctoral students** on any IU campus with a minimum GPA of 3.0. While preference and scholarship money will be given to SPEA students, the course is open to undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral students from any IU department. The syllabus calls for more difficult assignments and higher research expectations placed on graduate and doctoral students in comparison to undergraduate students.
